Every Tuesday and Thursday **the Grove Uniting church (Woodville Gardens)** works through their Op shop to help local vulnerable people. This occurs in many ways - just a few include giving bikes and helmets to kids so they can get to school, providing warm bedding for people sleeping rough, providing free English lessons to help combat social isolation for migrants.

Through a working friendship with the local school we are providing food, toiletries and children's items to many vulnerable people- including those freshly released from goal, people living or fleeing family violence, people that are homeless, those with mental health or physical disabilities, new arrivals and those who have been forgotten by the rest of the world. As we help these people with practical needs social workers and volunteers are also able to develop friendships and provide further love and welfare support.

One of the favourite times of the week is when about 20-30 local kids and their parents come to the church for free art/craft and cooking lessons. Despite not always having enough volunteers or supplies we have the never failing love of God that we give and show the precious children, which has been vital in the face of mourning the death of two of its children- one boy from an asthma attack the other a young girl due to suicide.

Truly I tell you, **whatever you did for** one of the **least** of these brothers and sisters of **mine**, you did for me.
